This course covers an in-depth array of different clinical topics, including basic virology of HIV, antiretroviral medications, and testing technology. Course Objectives

- Describe the HIV viral structure and its relationship to testing .
- State the goals and rationale behind ARV therapy.
- Discuss the role of nutrition assessment and management in HIV/AIDS care
- Identify the components of HIV testing and counseling as defined by Virginia statute and the CDC.

This training is intended for physicians, nurses, advanced practice nurses, physician's assistants, pharmacists, social workers, substance use professionals, case managers, and all others providing clinical care for HIV infected individuals.
